## **Research or quality improvement?**

Research and quality improvement are similar but distinct activities with important differences.

- Research is a systematic investigation designed to develop or contribute to general knowledge, aiming to generate new knowledge.
- Quality improvement is a systematic approach to improving processes and outcomes within a specific context, aiming to improve existing processes within a specific setting.

It is important to make the distinction between the type of activity you are completing to ensure you complete the right ethics application. Research projects require both a Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC) approval and research governance approval via a Site Specific Assessment before starting the project. If your work may be published or presented outside of the health service, please submit a HREC review exemption prior to starting your activity.

## Did you know? Research inspired by everyday life

While eating takeaway, two University of Chicago scientists Dr Bozhi Tian and Dr Yin Fang became very interested in their noodles. The noodles are stretched by hand until they are strong and elastic. The scientists questioned why the noodles didn't become thin and weak when stretched. They then ordered so many noodles from the restaurant that the owners became suspicious that the scientists were planning to open a rival restaurant. Instead they were experimenting, and found that common starch can be an ingredient for a composite that is like many of the properties in tissue. This led to the invention of a remarkable synthetic tissue. This could fundamentally change the way tissue-like materials are made, including medical implants, soft robotics and food packaging.
